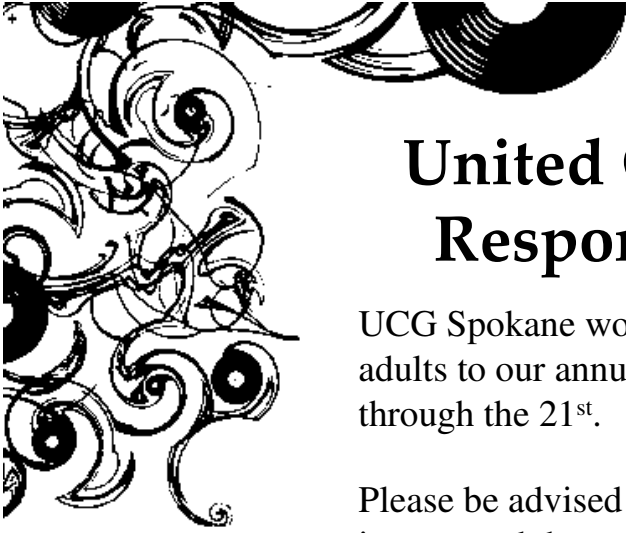

United Church of God Parental Responsibility & Dress Code

UCG Spokane would like to welcome all teens, parents and young adults to our annual Spokane Family Ski Weekend, January 19th through the 21st.

Please be advised of the parental responsibility and the dress code that is expected throughout these events.

This is a “family weekend.” Those under eighteen are subject to their parents or appointed adult(s). Parents: if you will not be present please inform us of the adult responsible for your son or daughter. Young adults over eighteen are personally responsible for their own behavior throughout the weekend.

The dress code is from the United Church of God official statement regarding expectations for youth at officially sponsored events. It reads as follows:

In order to honor God the Father, Jesus Christ and His Church, Christians of all ages should strive to set outstanding examples in every way, including being modest in dress, appearance, speech and conduct (1 Timothy 2:9; 4:12). Some examples of low standards of dress and appearance are body piercing (other than earrings for girls), short shorts, pants or other attire that shows underwear, halter-tops, spaghetti strap tops, clothing that is revealing (including midriffs), clothing that displays inappropriate messages, unnatural hair colors and inappropriate hair lengths (shorn for girls or long for guys).

Attendees at the Family Ski Weekend are asked to reflect modesty and purity in their dress and appearance.
